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

Principal to Parent

As we left for spring break last month, we all recognized that it had been a full year since we were first asked to stay home because of a pandemic. During that time, we had to figure out online platforms and the best ways in which to reach our students remotely. Teaching and learning was interrupted, and our students, teachers and parents showed tremendous resiliency during an especially challenging time.

Our students will continue to progress in the weeks that remain in this school year, and we are excited to see what they have achieved as end-of-the-year testing concludes next month.

Spring Events

Consideration includes adjustments that will ensure health and safety protocols. We'll communicate in the weeks to come what events we believe we can do safely as decisions are made.

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Spring Parent Teacher Conferences

Communication between teachers and parents occurs all year and parents are encouraged to connect with their child's teacher at any point they would like to talk about their child's performance. We have scheduled two dates to allow teachers to meet with parents and share end-of-the-year testing data, sign required literacy plans, or



discuss other topics. These conferences are <u>optional</u>, so not every parent will need to meet.

- 2) Parents are welcome to contact your child's teacher to request a conference



Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS)



The Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) are statewide tests of how well students have learned the skills outlined in the Colorado Academic Standards in English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Each student in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade will complete the testing. Which tests they'll take this year has changed compared to past years. A

waiver was submitted and approved through the US Dept of Education that reduces the number of tests we'll give. Third and 5th grade will take the English Language Art (ELA) test, and 4th grade will complete Math. There are three sessions within each test. More information will come about a process to optin if you want your child to complete the other assessment for that grade level.

Here are the new days and times in which our students are being tested:

- 3rd Grade (ELA): April 22, 27, 28 (testing begins at 9:00)
- 4th Grade: (Math) April 22, 27, 28 (testing begins at 9:00)
- 5th Grade: (ELA): April 22, 27, 28 (testing begins at 9:50)

Attendance is important every day. On testing days, be sure your child is in school so that they can complete this state requirement. Make up sessions will be scheduled for any test missed. Please schedule doctor's visits and other appointments around the times your child will be testing. Call the school if you have questions.

Dogs on School Grounds

As the temperatures warm, we tend to see many more dogs on school grounds. Dogs are welcome, but we do request that they be leashed and in control when our students are present. Please recognize that not all students are comfortable around dogs. They may not have a dog, maybe had a traumatic experience, or the sheer physical size of the dog might scare them. Help us teach our students dog safety, such as encouraging them to ask before walking up to pet a dog or hug them, and to avoid facial bites by keeping their face away




from the dog's mouth if attempting to kiss the dog or hoping to get licked. Keeping your dog close and with a short leash is best practice, especially when small children are present.

This is a very important day for these students as it is likely the 1st T & F meet they have ever been in. Students will have the opportunity to compete in four field events and four sprint running events. Unfortunately, we cannot have volunteers or spectators, but I am sure your children will come home with stories! I will take pictures and post them on our school website as well.

If your child participated in the 5210+ challenge in February and earned 80 checkmarks, I thank you. Their t-shirts will arrive on May 1st and, if we had enough participants, some prize money for Beattie.

In wellness news, I have finished teaching the kindergarten and 1st grade classes their lessons about the meaning of 5210+ . In 1st grade, we are also learning about trusted adults. Second graders have been learning the difference between teasing and bullying. Third grade and fourth grade students are learning about stress and what they can do to avoid it and handle it. Fifth graders are learning about positive characteristics. They have completed some amazing work on this topic and demonstrated this by having us practice the positive characteristic in a game that they got to create and lead.
