Student Birthday Celebrations



At the end of each month, students celebrating a birthday that month are invited to the lunchroom for a special birthday treat. We sing 'Happy Birthday" together as a school family, and then students enjoy a special birthday cupcake provided by our Beattie Action Team (BAT) parent group. Students with special diets are given an alternative treat. It is

fun to celebrate our students in this special way.

Halloween Parties & Parade

We are still planning to have our annual Halloween parties and parade. We'll celebrate on Halloween, Monday October 31. We are still planning the Halloween costume parade, and hope that the weather holds so that we



can parade outside for those parents wanting to come and watch.

Fall Frolic Fun Run

The Fall Frolic Fun Run will happen at different times of the day on Friday, October 28. Grades will run at different times. The fun run is a fundraiser organized and run by Booster, a company specializing in these types of fundraisers. They provide the donation platform, prizes and related materials, and race day



equipment. Their staff are also in the building during the week and help in the classrooms. Basically, the Beattie Action Team (BAT) is buying a service and paying for them to organize and run the fundraiser, race day, and anything that comes in between. Booster keeps 50% of the money made from the fun run to pay for their service. If parents don't want their children to participate for any reason, or they have a different opinion and don't want to support Booster, a donation can be sent directly to BAT, our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO).

Parking Lot Safety



Please be mindful of our students on the sidewalks and streets around our school in the morning and at dismissal. Students can be easily distracted or forget to follow safety rules. Be on alert, put down your cell phones and follow the traffic signs when dropping off or picking up your children. Practice patience and turn taking in order to keep everyone safe. We have seen an increase in the number of adult bike riders in the bike lane in front of our

school. Many are commuting to work or CSU, and they travel at higher speeds. Be mindful of their presence, especially if you are crossing over the bike lane to drop off your child or to turn into the parking lot or cul de sac.

Weather Changes

The weather in Colorado can quickly change, and what starts out as a clear day can end with rain or even snow. Please be sure that your children leave the house with proper clothing for changes in the weather. We will always try to get



some fresh air and go outside for recess, unless the weather is extreme.

Our general rule is that we will go outside unless the temperature is 10-15 degrees or below, including wind chill, or the conditions are poor, making recess or outside play unsafe. Students tend to take off their jackets at recess, and our Lost & Found grows through the year. Write your child's name in their coat. Encourage your child to check the Lost & Found rack (in the hallway between Ms. Miller's kindergarten classroom and the yellow pod doors) for clothing they have lost at school. Because of the accumulation and our limited space to store Lost & Found items, we do donate what's left on the rack once it's full and students have stopped claiming their things. The rack is pulled out multiple times to allow students the chance to stop and look for their things.

School Advisory Committee (SAC) Meeting



The SAC is made up of staff, parents, and community members working together to help ensure that our school is the best. No other advisory group in our school has as much influence in changing what we do or how we do it. Come work with us with the goal of providing the best experiences possible

for our students. Our second meeting of the year is Tuesday, October 18 from 5:00-6:00PM in our school library. Topics will change each month based on what has been identified by those in attendance or that require committee input and feedback.

Thanks for all you do to send your children happy, healthy, well fed and rested to school each day. That is the formula for success!

In PE class, we have been playing soccer. I am so please will the skill improvement I have seen already. Next, we will be playing with frisbees and learning about the wide variety of games that we can play with a frisbee – disc golf, ultimate frisbee, can jam and more. Since our Boosterthon Fun Run is coming up on Oct 19th, I have been including fitness warm-ups in each class as well.

Our first topic in Health class this year has been belonging. "You belong here" is our theme. Ask your child how many places they belong. You should hear answers like: in class, in health class in 2nd grade, at Beattie, on my sports teams, at home, in a family etc.

Thank you for helping your 4th and 5th grade students with their homework of finding out how they got their name. The students really enjoyed sharing their individual story. Telling their name story added a level of connection to their family.

Kindness and Nutrition are the next two topics for health class.

Our 50-mile running club is off to a great start. 60 people came out to run at our first official meeting! What fun we had trying out the new automated tracking system. The goal is for all the participants to run 50 miles over the course of this school year. The first session of the running club meets each Wednesday from Sept 7^{th} – Nov 16^{th} . It is not too late to join. It is a drop-in club, so participation each week is not required. If you are trying to achieve the 50 mile goal, you will need to attend most sessions. If you would like your child to still join the running club, have them get a permission slip from me to take how for your signature.

We had our first, of four, Walk and Wheel Challenges on Sept 14th. WOW! Over half of the students participated in this wellness event. Very impressive. The 1st grade had the most participants, by percentage, so they have the coveted trophy in their classroom. The next Walk and Wheel Challenge is on December 7th.

We will have two Roller Skating parties this year. The first party at Rollerland is on Friday, November 4th and the second one is on March 31st.


